

## **Detroit Black Community Food Security Network**

### **D-Town Farm Farmer Job Posting**

The Detroit Black Community Food Security Network is seeking an enthusiastic, committed, and socially conscious staff member to join our team of farmers at D-Town Farm, a seven-acre organic farm in the City of Detroit's Rouge Park.

#### **Summary:**

The Farmer is a part-time, temporary, at-will employee of the Detroit Black Community Food Security Network (DBCFSN), a 501c3 non-profit organization. They will work no more than 20 hours per week from May 3 – November 21, 2021. They will be paid \$13.16 per hour. As a part-time employee, the Farmer is not eligible for benefits. The Farmer will be paid bi-weekly. All applicable City, State and Federal taxes will be deducted from the gross bi-weekly amount they earn. The Farmer must support DBCFSN's mission and social justice approach to food system change. An understanding of African-American history and culture is essential.

The Farmer reports to the Farm Manager and is responsible for:

- Actively participating in weekly farm operations meetings.
- Under the leadership of the Farm Manager, and with other Farmers, performing a variety of tasks necessary for the progress, maintenance and growth of the farm, including but not limited to:
  - Hoophouse and field production.
  - Maintaining integrity of hoophouses.
  - Irrigating crops.
  - Harvesting and preparation of crops for markets.
  - Maintaining farm landscaping and aesthetics.
  - Conducting inventory, storage, maintenance and replacement of machinery, equipment and tools.
  - Implementing animal and insect control measures.
  - Maintaining records on planting, soil amendments, crop or soil diseases, and crop yields.
